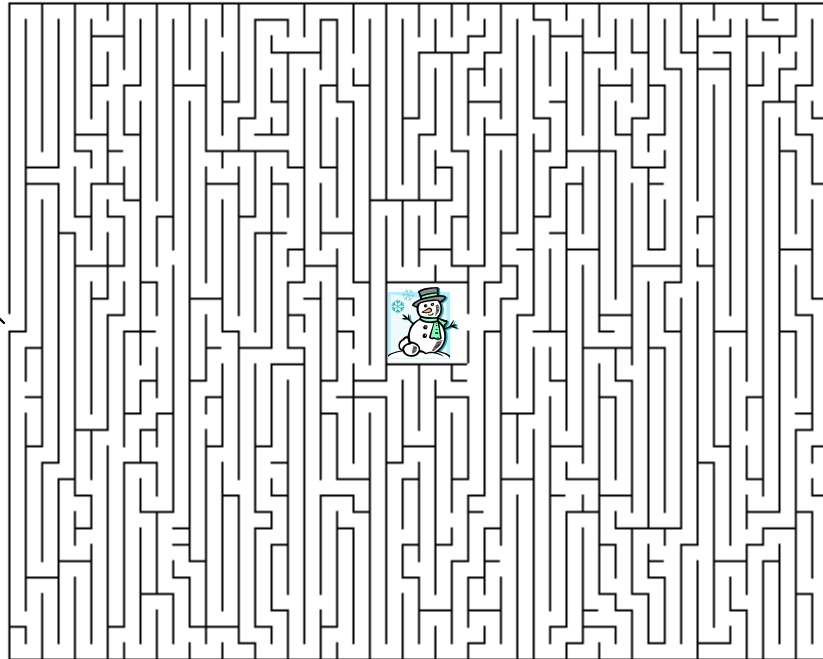
### Children or Angels
